

As we continue to share God's love around the world partnering together with you we press forward with energy and strength, which is the joy of the Lord!

“Auntie Huern is 63 years old and has six kids and ten grandchildren living with her on the street. Every time our team met her she told us how difficult their life is - how she has so much pain inside her heart because she is the poorest wife to her husband, the poorest mother to her children, and the poorest grandma to her grandchildren. She told us, ‘Sometimes I don’t want to live anymore because I have so much debt and none of my children help me at all. Everyday I have to provide food for them and if I don’t have any food, they would be starving and mad at me.’ We shared Jesus with her and told her He is the only one who can give her hope for the rest of her life. We prayed for

her and her whole family. “In 2004, a young abandoned boy named Helder came to live with us. He was uneducated and did not know how to love or be loved. Our team eagerly took him in and made him a part of our family. Years later, Helder went on to medical school. He recently graduated in 2018 and is now a qualified doctor working in pediatrics in Nampula, Mozambique. We are all so very proud of him!

Sometimes the work we do is instantly gratifying, like when we witness a miraculous healing or a village is given access to clean water for the first time. **But in most cases we are in this for the long haul, investing daily in relationships and spurring each other on to become more like Jesus.** We rejoice for the quick victories and deeply celebrate the transforming power of God's love in Helder's life and so many more like him.”



# RELIEF

“**R**elief is compassion in action - it is bringing spiritual and physical peace to those affected by disaster.

When Hurricane Maria devastated Puerto Rico, we mobilized to stop for the ones who had lost so much and still had a long road of recovery ahead of them. Our Iris Relief team partnered with Pastor Victor and his wife Angel and their church, Iglesia Casa Restauración, to serve the residents in their community of Fajardo. Even though most of the area already had power restored, the church was still without power yet they pressed on distributing supplies, helping with repairs, and ministering to the hurting. **When our team arrived, we immediately began praying for God to restore power to the church.** Not much later a utility truck drove by and that

was the very thing Pastor Victor needed. Without hesitation, we chased the truck yelling, “STOP!!” The tail lights lit up and the truck started backing up. We talked with the electric company workers and requested two transformers.

They came back and installed two transformers that evening and ran the new wires. A couple of days later the church received electricity for the first time since Hurricane Maria! **All Pastor Victor could do was worship and thank God, and now he is sharing this testimony to encourage others on the island.”**

# DEVELOPMENT

“**T**he city of Acauã is in the arid interior of Piauí, Brazil. It is a remote and desolate area subject to extreme weather conditions, low levels of education, and lack of economic opportunity. As a result, the people are often depressed and hopeless. **One of our main focuses as a ministry is to create programs that develop a sense of value and hope for the future.**

When we came to Piauí in 2015, I asked God if I would be able to use my training as a ballerina to communicate His truths - that in Him alone we find hope, love, faith, and joy. I wanted to show the people in the community our Papa God cares for them and will never abandon them. That desire led me to start ballet and Zumba classes. We started with 30 nervous and eager ballet students and 20 women attending our Zumba classes. We saw relationships blossom immediately as we practiced and played together. Each time I taught a class I could see how their lives were being

transformed and the fruit of the Spirit became more abundant.

**As of today, we have 120 women and girls taking our classes and we are even expanding into the surrounding villages, using dance and friendship to show the love of God.** And each year at Christmastime our little ballerinas present a Christmas recital to the whole town. Many parents have come to know Jesus when they see the transformation in their daughters' lives.

I am so honored and grateful to be able to do this. When I became a missionary I believed I would be the teacher, but instead these past years I have learned so much about simplicity, hospitality, and perseverance. Because we have journeyed together our lives will never be the same.”

# HEALING

“A pregnant woman came to our clinic asking for help because she had just visited a doctor who did an ultrasound and discovered she had an ectopic pregnancy. She was told she needed emergency surgery to remove the baby or else she would die. She was devastated at the diagnosis and on top of that had no money to pay for the life-saving surgery. That is what led her to our clinic. **One of our team members prayed for her to feel and experience the Father’s love for her** and for God to do what only He can do by doing a miracle in her body. After that, our medical team took her back to the

hospital where the same doctor did another ultrasound and found the baby **INSIDE** her uterus and perfectly healthy!

God continually surprises us at our clinic because sometimes He brings healing through treatments and medications and other times He uses us to declare Divine health and we see extraordinary miracles. It is a humbling honor to administer God’s love to the sick; He is the Great Physician.”

“Iris Global has been abundantly blessed to fund the work of ministers around the world who want to see God’s love pour out on the needy, abandoned, and forgotten. Iris Global and its four subsidiaries (Iris Air, Iris Nautical, Iris Global Churches, and Iris Relief) are dedicated to this goal. Each subsidiary has a unique purpose:

Iris Air operates the plane, which is housed in Pemba, Mozambique. Iris Nautical operates the catamaran which is used for outreaches along the coast of northern Mozambique. The plane and catamaran were both moved from Iris Global to the respective subsidiaries during this fiscal year.


Iris Global Churches serves to ordain ministers who seek a ministerial license with Iris. It provides a way for ministers

### **MACHAMBA**

Our farm in Mize, Mozambique grows a variety of fruits and vegetables used in the meals for our children, and has completed organic certification and licensing for their moringa tress.

### **IRIS AVIATION**

The plane took 37 flights including the annual trip to Malawi to minister at the conference for our 411 churches there and our first ever flight to our center in Madagascar.
